Fundamentals of Abstracting Class – Spring 2022

MCR is hosting an on-line Fundamentals of Abstracting course beginning April 1, 2022, to be taken at your own pace through May 15, 2022. This class geared toward new abstractors who are not familiar with the abstracting process. If you are not familiar with abstracting and/or the required fields, this is a great place to start learning. Students will view fifteen pre-recorded **Voice Thread** presentations of the Missouri Cancer Registry Abstract Code Manual at their own pace. When completed with the **Voice Thread** presentations students can work through five practice cases using the Missouri Cancer Registry and Research Abstract Code Manual. SEER*Educate

2022 Updates - What exercises are being updated to match updates to various manuals?

The SEER*Educate team has reviewed the answers/rationales against the updated manuals for Solid Tumor Rules (STR), Heme, and ICD-O changes effective with 1/1/2022. While the case scenarios in existing modules with diagnosis dates prior to 01/01/2022 have not been changed, the rationales for a small number of cases were updated to reflect changes by the updated manuals. This allows registrars to learn the coding changes over time as well as how and when to apply the current rules.

ABSTRACTING TIPS

Class of Case Clarification

All cases required to be reported to MCR should be assigned Class of Case codes 00-23, or code 32. MCR requires reporting of AIN III, VIN III and VAIN III, although these cases are not required by the CoC. Cases of these diagnoses submitted from CoC facilities should use Class of Case codes 00-23 or code 32, NOT codes 34 or 36. Class 34 and 36 pertain to CoC program standards and do not apply to MCR abstracting standards.
