DUE DATES

To be on track, large hospitals (>500 cases/yr.) typically would be expected to have abstracted February 2023 diagnosis cases by September 15, 2023. Smaller facilities (<300 cases /yr.) are expected to report the 1st Quarter of 2023 by October 15, 2023. We are monitoring reporting timeliness and completeness *closely* in 2023.

ABSTRACTING TIP

Sequence Number

The hospital sequence number represents the number of **primary cancers** a patient may have during his lifetime. **'00'** indicates the first and only primary cancer; **'01'** would indicate the first of more than one primary cancer; **'02'** indicates the second of two or more primary cancers; **'03'** denotes the third of three or more cancers; etc.

- Sequence numbers are assigned in the order diagnosed. Any tumor in the patient's past must be taken into account when sequencing subsequently accessioned tumors, regardless of where it was diagnosed.
- If the patient has a prior cancer(s), please include these cases in your sequence number and then the subsequent tumor sequentially.
- If the patient has two cancers diagnosed on the same date, the priority of sequencing is given to the most invasive cancer.
- Sequence numbers should be reassigned if the facility learns later of an unaccessioned tumor that affects the sequence.

CLASS OF CASE

All cases required to be reported to MCR should be assigned Class of Case codes 00 - 23, or code 32. MCR requires reporting of AIN III, VIN III, VAIN III. We know these cases are not required by the CoC. For ease of reporting, we **will** allow them to be reported as codes **34 or 36** if no other Class Case code can be used for your circumstance.

DEATH CLEARANCE

Death Clearance (DC) follow back for the reporting year 2021 is just around the corner! Please be on the lookout for a separate notification email in the coming days regarding the official start of the death clearance follow back process.

The DC process will essentially be the same as last year. If you are new to the process or would like a refresher, please refer to the written instructions found on the MCR website at

MCR is Hiring!

Missouri Cancer Registry has an opening for a Central Registry Data Specialist. The position entails assisting with registry operations by monitoring, managing and/or abstracting cases from various sources, including circuit-riding hospitals and/or non-hospital facilities (e.g., long-term care facilities, physician offices, ambulatory care centers, pathology labs, etc.) to ensure that the data submitted to the Missouri Cancer Registry meets Missouri statute requirements and national standards for quality, timeliness and completeness as set forth by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Program of Cancer Registries (NPCR) and the North American Association of Central Cancer Registries (NAACCR).

The CTR credential is preferred but CTR-eligible individuals are welcome to apply. An associate degree with college-level courses in Human Anatomy and/or Physiology and medical terminology or equivalent skills is required.

NCRA - New CTR Credential Announced

The National Cancer Registrars Association (NCRA) and its Council on Certification have updated the credential name of CTR, Certified Tumor Registrar, to **ODS**, **Oncology Data Specialist**. The new name better aligns with the evolving scope of practice of cancer registrars and current professional practice terminology. The use of the new credential begins January 1, 2024; NCRA anticipates the adoption will take at least a full calendar year.

CTR credential holders are encouraged to wait until January 1, 2024, to use the new credential.
